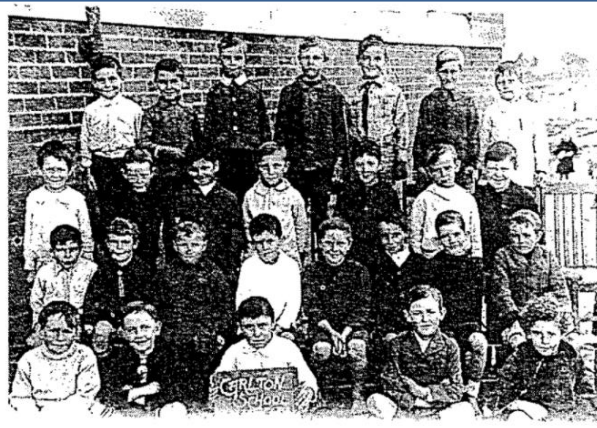

1918-1930

Carlton PS began with an enrolment of approximately 160 infants students.

A building containing four classrooms was erected on the Percival Street site between Cameron and Byrnes Streets ahead of schedule and was officially opened in June 1918.

We know this as half of block B (KGreen)

The first teacher in charge was Miss Alice Day.

By 1920 the enrolments had rapidly increased to over 400 students.



In April 1923, with an enrolment reaching 700, a two storey building containing 8 classrooms was built.

We know this as half of Block A -PC lab, Languages rooms, some Year 1 and 2 rooms)

In January 1928 urgent additions were requested and in June, work for a three storey brick building attached to the existing Primary School was erected facing Percival Street. This included 8 classrooms and a basement utilized as two large weathersheds.

Further additions to the school were completed in 1926 including 4 new classrooms.

We know this as the other half of block B. KOrange)

During 1924 the school was divided into three departments, and by 1926 the enrolment had risen to 1040. (309 boys, 306 girls and 425 infants)

In March 1923 the school was divided into two departments: Primary and Infants. With Mr George Humphries as the school's first Headmaster.
