1946-1960

In 1951 there were 870 pupils

125 mothers a month
volunteered to man the canteen
and from there many lifetime
friendships were made.

Mr John Dutton was
appointed principal in
1950 and remained at
Carlton for 8 years. He
gave the school much
needed stability.

During the 1950's "Meet
the Teacher" night were
introduced.

The first Education
Week was held.

Wearing school uniform
was introduced.

All which we still have!

A stage in the assembly
hall was built costing 52
pounds and 10 shillings.

In 1955, Dr Haneman, an
ex student, became the
school patron

Dr John Hewson, one of
Australia's most
prominent politicians
was enrolled at Carlton
in 1951 until 1955. He
was known as a serious
boy with a streak of the
devil in him.

school Canteen! The
Canteen came from the
hard work of the
Parents & Citizens
Association who
organised a carnival on
Fry's Reserve over 9
nights and with 72
volunteers raised
enough money to equip
the canteen.

former N.S.W. Attorney
General was also a
Carlton boy.

In 1946 Mrs E Kircher became the school's
teacher-librarian and the lovely mural that
adorned the library until late 2000 (now the
Greek Languages room) was painted and donated
by Edward J. Sackey, a returned soldier, who lived
in Byrnes Street and undertook this task as a
rehabilitation exercise.

Carlton's best known
former pupil enrolled
in the 1950's. She was
the actress Jacki
Weaver, ex-wife of
television personality,
Derryn Hinch.
