1970 Mr Thompson was appointed as principal.

> After several years of declining enrolments, the school population suddenly increased. What began as a trickle in the 1960's became a veritable flood in the 1970's and in 1975 children whose parents had been born overseas outnumbered native born pupils for the first time.

The school tunic was modified in 1962 to make it cooler and easier to launder. Coloured t-shirts for sport was introduced in 1965. Then a new girls summer uniform was introduced in 1970. By 1975 the girls uniform consisted of an A line blue shift dress, yellow skivvie, with a blue jumper or cardigan

1962 the playground asphalting is nearly complete

In 1961 the P & C sign was erected on the corner of Cameron & Percival Streets.

By 1965 there was an easy chair for staff who did not feel well – but no sick area for them.

In 1969 gas heaters were installed and electric lighting was now working but no power points were installed in classrooms.
