1991-1998

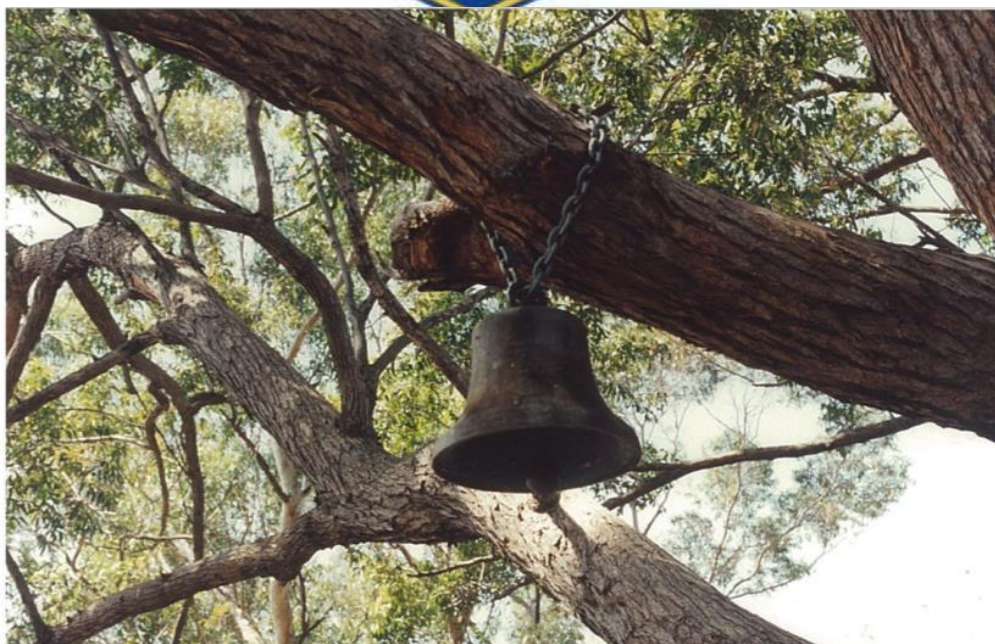
Mr Gavin Patterson

1998-2010

1991 New sports uniform introduced. Year 6 T-shirts with names on it were introduced.

1992
Multicultural language classes started. By 1997 full time Arabic, Macedonian and Mandarin community language teachers were appointed.

These we still have today but known as CLOTE & LOTE languages.



2003
783 students and 28 classes.
A school Environmental Club and a Clean-up Brigade was formed and run by the SRC members. Maori as a Community Language Program was officially introduced for the first time in a NSW school.

1993
Single sex classes for Years 5 & 6.
75th birthday of the school.
Gifted and talented classes began, which is now known as the extension class.

2005 Class size reductions. Kindergarten now to have 20 students and Year 1 to have 22 students. Stage 3 Kinder Buddy system was introduced

2001.
745 students and 27 classes.
A large covered sandpit was installed near B Block.
The Accelerated Reader program was implemented.
Peer Mediation began.
Mr Gavin Patterson was awarded the DET P & C Primary Principal of the Year.

2002.
Student numbers 775 with 27 classes.
Official Hall and Canteen Opening on 25/11/2002.
P & C introduced "Family Portraits".
16 computers and new desks were purchased for students use in the library.
A circular Federation Garden was completed in the centre of the assembly area.
Sponsorship for a World Vision child in Indonesia was established.

1998
Kindergarten Orientation program was developed.

2000
706 students and 26 classes.
All demountable classrooms were networked.
Administration/Library Building was completed.

2004 - 29 classes
School website under construction
Frog pond installed. 13 demountables on site. "Dance 2 B Fit" was introduced.

Mr Patterson introduced a Student Representative Council of students and encouraged them to have a very vocal voice in the needs and activities of the school. The SRC is still very active within the school.
